LAY SPEAKER: PRE-INTERVIEW GUIDE

I. PRE-LAY SPEAKER

When a person becomes a candidate for the lay speaker ministry, the congregation shall notify the District Ministry Commission and arrange for a joint meeting of representatives of the church board and the District Ministry Commission to examine the candidate. Such an examination should include: the candidate's call; natural ability; moral and spiritual fitness; willingness to prepare for the duties of the ministry of lay speaker; the candidate's commitment to the history, beliefs, and priorities of the Church of the Brethren; and the candidate's personal faith perspective.

II. THE INTERVIEW

- **A.** The District Ministry Commission is responsible for guiding the pre-lay speaker process. This document and related papers may be reproduced only for deliberation by the commission and/or its interview committee.
- **B.** The candidate fills out the Interview Guide and returns it to the District Ministry Commission before the interview.
- **C.** In addition to reviewing the Interview Guide, the District Ministry Commission or its interview committee prepares questions emerging from or related to it, as well as additional questions, pertaining to the candidate's faith and life.
- **D.** The District Ministry Commission is free to ask for additional materials which will assist them in the interview process. These materials could include transcripts, a physical examination, Readiness for Ministry testing, etc. Sufficient lead time should be allowed for these materials to be available before the interview.
- **E.** If the candidate is married, the spouse should be invited to join the interview.

III. FOLLOWING THE INTERVIEW

A. A recommendation regarding the candidate must be processed by the District Ministry Commission and the congregation so that each body may make a decision regarding the person's readiness for the ministry of lay speaker.

B. The original document and related papers are to be retained in the district office. All other copies are to be destroyed by the District Executive/Minister at the conclusion of the pre-lay speaker process.

IV. TERM OF SERVICE

The term is for three (3) years and can be renewed by recommendation of the calling congregation and approval of the District Ministry Commission.

V. NOTES TO THE CANDIDATE

- A. The following questions are asked so that you can provide written responses in preparation for the interview with the District Ministry Commission or its interview committee. If there is more space needed for your answers, please include an extra sheet (or sheets) with this form.
- B. If you move your membership to another congregation within the district, that congregation and the District Ministry Commission must approve your continued lay speaker status.
- C. If you move your membership to a congregation in another district, you will need to reapply for lay speaker status with its District Ministry Commission.
